Informatics 2009

A number of CIPS members have inquired about the dates and location for INFORMATICS 2009. Informatics is CIPS' annual conference and is considered to be the society's premier educational event of the year. The Canadian Council of Information Technology Professionals (CCITP), CIPS' Governing Board elected to defer INFORMATICS until 2010. This decision was made in light of a number of priorities related to CIPS' accreditation under the IP3 and the introduction of a new CIPS designation aligned to the international standard. These activities were of high priority and required the Society's full attention. In the interim, PDit Canada, CIPS' educational arm has been asked to prepare a three year business plan including recommendation on INFORMATICS. The CCITP will be considering these recommendations and a decision on INFORMATICS 2010 is expected by June of this year. Members will be advised accordingly on any future plans for Informatics.

Canadian Coalition for Tomorrow's ICT Skills - A National ICT Week to tackle the ICT labor shortage

The Canadian Coalition for Tomorrow's ICT Skills (CCICT) will conduct a series of events and activities to tackle the crisis in the information and communications technology labor market of an increasing shortage of university graduates with information technology skills. The marquee event will be a National ICT Week to be held in Fall 2009.

The Coalition, includes companies, academic institutions, professional associations, industry organizations like CIPS, and other stakeholders with an interest in developing Canada's ICT capabilities, invites students, employees, employers, educators, parents, and governments to join in making National ICT Week the vehicle for Canada's vision of 21st century career innovation. Activities will inform students, educators, employers and immigrant organizations about the exciting changes in ICT careers.

ICT jobs are becoming increasingly complex, demanding and specialized, but are also a lot more interesting, exciting, diverse, and relevant to Canada's most pressing business and social challenges. In every field - from entertainment to health to the environment - ICT is at the cutting edge of change and creativity, calling for a new kind of ICT professional, more like a well-rounded Renaissance person than a traditional technologist.

Over the next eight years, Canada's employers will hire about 150,000 new information and communications technology professionals in response to ongoing growth demands and employee retirements. But employers cannot find or hire the ICT professionals that are needed. While some regions have a large pool of ICT workers, their qualifications do not match the requirements needed. Other regions, particularly Alberta and Saskatchewan, face ICT talent shortages across the spectrum from technicians to programmers, engineers, consultants and managers.

New Program Preparing Internationally Educated Professionals for Canada's ICT Sector

A new initiative by the Information and Communications Technology Council (ICTC) aims to improve the integration of internationally educated professionals (IEPs) into the Canadian ICT workforce. The program is funded by Citizenship and Immigration Canada, and is one of the programs in ICTC's Immigration Initiatives program.

ICTC's Online Workshops for Newcomers & IEP Stakeholders project will be developing two online workshop modules in English for internationally educated professionals overseas and their immigration stakeholders. These two workshops will teach essential knowledge about working in Canada, including the process of coming to Canada, what Canadian ICT employers need, and resources available to foster development of technical, business, language, and workplace-communication competencies. This project will further establish Canada as a leader in the attraction, retention and integration of internationally educated professionals in the ICT sector.

Comprehensive research by ICTC shows that Canadian ICT sector will need to recruit between 15,800 and 22,350 ICT workers each year between 2008 and 2015. Internationally Educated Professionals (IEPs) will account for 30 per cent or more of the annual supply of ICT professionals. Without the integration of groups currently under-represented in the ICT sector - including IEPs, women and Aboriginals - Canada will not be able to compete or innovate in today's global economy. IEPs - whether they are seasoned professionals, recent graduates or those employed outside their field - are viewed as particularly well positioned to fill vital roles in Canada's ICT sector.
